Abstract—Human happiness and wellbeing depends up on good health, which leads to more productivity. Health is not only important for individual income, demographic trends and education, but also Socio-economic growth and development of the nation. That's the reason many developed and developing nations investing on health in GDP, but unfortunately share of health expenditure in GDP falling down with less than 1.5 % during 2011-15 (World Bank) in developing nations. India also in the same path with 1.3 % of health expenditure in GDP during 2011-15 (World Bank), but has been increasing over the years. Government of India and Andhra Pradesh have recognised the importance of rural health, have implemented many rural health schemes. The Rajiv Aarogyasri community health insurance (RACHI) is one of most popular social insurance scheme introduced by A.P. government in 2007 with Public Private Partnership(PPP).
