An ardent pacifist and outspoken advocate for women's suffrage, Addams was also the first American woman to win the Nobel Peace Prize.
- Corazon Aquino (1933-2009)- She was the first female President of the Philippines. She still stood tall as the people's choice.
- Rachel Carson (1907-1964) If Green movement exist today, it is because of her. Her monumental book *Silent Spring* documented the devastating effects of pesticides like DDT on birds and the environment, and the revelations eventually helped lead to the creation of the Environmental Protection Agency.

The same year, Time named her one of the "100 most influential people in the world". She was appointed as an Ambassador for Child Rights in 2010.
